Eduardo Gonzalez was named the Access to Justice Fellow at [Georgetown Law's Institute of Technology Law and Policy](#) in September 2017. In this role, he will be responsible for updating the Self-Represented Litigation Network's (SRLN) [2008 Best Practices in Court Based Programs for the Self-Represented](#) and converting it to an on-line peer networking tool. The final product will include an updated list of best practices, as well as a county-level database of innovations and self-help reforms that are improving litigant's access to justice throughout the United States.

Eduardo received a Bachelor of Arts from Brown University and his JD from Northeastern University School of Law (NUSL). Prior to this placement, Eduardo worked on [TIG funded](#) projects for the [NuLawLab](#) and Connecticut Legal Aid as a game designer to develop browser and [mobile games for self-represented litigants](#). During law school, Eduardo served as a lawyering fellow for a team of first year law students on a social justice project with Tor Project, Inc. and was a student attorney with NUSL's Intellectual Property Clinic, the IP Co-Lab.
