

Article: What Standards Should We Use To Judge Our Courts? (Greacen 1988)



Two themes run through this article—the search for standards by which to measure the performance of courts and the search for ways to improve the courts' public image. Greacen notes that although definitive standards for judging courts did not exist at the time of the article's publication, there were many useful measures. He added that an ongoing effort to both further define and meet standards would enhance public respect for the courts.
